ting last minute preparations completed before the kids start coming. Here's Callum's report.







My dad did an amazing job doing a lot of painting and finishing up the toilet/shower house. And mum was on the sewing machine adapting/resizing 80 blankets to fit the new bedding we were able to purchase. We bought enough bedding to supply all of our sleeping quarters - 80 pillows, 80 blankets, 80 fitted sheets and 80 pillow cases. Praise the Lord we can get rid of all the

bedding with holes, tears and stains!

We also installed new lighting on the outside of the toilet/shower house and at the new water station. And also brought the first two trucks of stones and put them around the toilet/shower house and the water station.



Camps don't actually start until July, but this year we've had some weekend church



groups out for the day. One was a youth group with approximately 30 teenagers. They enjoyed the beautiful weather, had a BBQ, and played various sports, concluding with worship time and a short Bible study under the Pole Barn. At a different time a church group of about 100

came for a day at the camp just to enjoy the outdoors and fellowship together with a picnic. Friendship Camp is for these shorter events as well. We're happy churches are making our camp their "go to place" for church outings.



And finally, we've been able to install new roofing on the staff cabin, including board walk all the way around. As well as giving both the staff cabin and the volunteer cabin a fresh coat of stain to freshen them up a bit. We are thankful for all the work we've been able to accomplish, but again, it's only because of partnering friends who have given so generously. She had been asked to give a report in her church, but wanted to make sure she had her memories confirmed. As a result we decided this might be of interest to friends of the mission. REMEMBERING FRIENDSHIP INTERNATIONAL'S FIRST MISSIONARY TRIP TO ROMANIA

This is my personal remembrance of traveling with Del Huff, founder of Friendship International, which is still an active ministry organization.

Del, along with 25-30 of us traveled together to Romania in 1990, the year immediately following the execution of Nicolae Ceauşescu, the Ro-

manian dictator who was executed on December 25, Christmas Day, 1989.

My name is Natalie Klostermann. I met Del in 1990 at a Romanian Baptist Church in Phoenix, AZ. A Romanian family by the name of Neamtu, who were close friends with Richard and Sabina Wurmbrand, founder of the Voice of the Martyrs, and personal friends of mine, invited me to come and meet Del and hear about his plan for a trip into Romania at this strategic and historic time in Romanian history.

Del explained that the Wurmbrands had gotten word from the underground pastors that they needed help from the pastors in the West and USA to "brain storm" how to begin the rebuilding of their country's infrastructure, along with encouragement and an infusion of joy and hope for the Romanian Churches and her people.

Del asked me if I was Romanian, or spoke the Romanian language or had been to Romania. I answered no, to all three questions. He explained he was forming a team(s) to go to Romania and he wanted to sign me up to join, because he said he felt I was meant to be a part of this ministry effort. He said he wanted me to be a part of the intercessory prayer and concert ministries. That would include intercessory praying at all of our meetings to bring hope - healing - refreshment and joy to the people, including the pastors and their wives.

Del explained as part of his vision he wanted to have -

• sports camps • orphanage ministry • music teams for concerts • and, teaching teams for assisting in "how to" start businesses.

When the teams had signed up we had at least 20 different denominations represented, ages 15-72; boys, girls, men and women from all across the country.

We flew from various departure airports to England and on to Germany where we loaded into vans for the long drive to Hungary. There we stayed at a former nazi/communist military training camp. We were so excited that we were the first to use the camp since communism, taking it back and claiming it for Jesus' purposes. This was in Estergom, Hungary, not far from Budapest, on the Danube River. We stayed at this camp for several days in preparation for our ministry in Romania. Our time was spent praying together and preparing for the various ministry areas we would be working in.

When we left, we knew we were going into the unknown, as Romania was in the midst of great change and unrest. We came to the first border crossing and it was closed, not open for crossing. Then we traveled to another crossing and there was such confusion, we couldn't cross there either. So, we made our way to the 3rd crossing and all the vans made it across except the one I was in.

We were bringing musical instruments and sound equipment to use, and the border guards wanted to keep all of it, but, God had a way out for us. Our Romanian friends, the Neamtus, who were traveling with us, told us we were going to have to get a letter from my home church, on official letterhead stating that the churches from the USA were donating the equipment and instruments to the people and churches of Romania. This, then assured the border guards of our intentions and opened doors for us to enter Romania. When the other vans saw that we were having problems with the border guards and were being held, they pulled over and all began praying for us. It was an exciting time to trust our Lord to get us through the border crossing.
